COMMON COLD REMEDIES

For aches and discomfort

• Tylenol - 2 Extra Strength

For sneezing, itchy watery eyes, post nasal drip

Benadryl

For nasal congestion

- · Steam Inhalers
- Saline Nose Drops
- Neti Pot or other saline nasal flushes
- Sudafed with active ingredient Pseudoephedrine-the one you sign for at the pharmacy. (Ok to use after 12 weeks of pregnancy)

For sore throat

- Chloraseptic Spray
- Throat Lozenges/Cough Drops (Ricola, Halls)
- Salt water gargles
- Tylenol (2 Extra Strength)

For cough

- Robitussin or Robitussin DM (Ok to use after 12 weeks of pregnancy)
- Mucinex (Ok to use after 12 weeks of pregnancy)
- Hot tea with honey

These may also help with common cold symptoms:

- Rest
- · Increasing fluids
- Chicken Soup

Flu Shot - The Flu Shot is strongly recommended for all pregnant women

Tdap Vaccine - The Tdap vaccine is strongly recommended for all pregnant women in the third trimester of pregnancy. Get the vaccine any time after 27 weeks and before 36 weeks of pregnancy.

Please note that during pregnancy you should not take Motrin, Ibuprofen, Advil, Aleve, any generic of these, or any other NSAIDS.
